“BEYOND the Disappearing Nine-Patch” Workshop

In this technique class you will use two 10” fabric squares to create a simple pinwheel block and then learn how to transform the pinwheel into a totally new block. Lots of possibilities for new blocks!

Supply List

- 10-20 (or more) ten-inch squares of fabric, half dark and half light [Hints: One finished block uses two 10” squares. Large scale prints do not work well.]
- cutting mat at least 13” x 13” (but not super-large)
- rotary cutter, extra blades
- acrylic ruler at least 14” long
- sewing machine, power cord, foot pedal, accessories, ¼” foot (very helpful)
- neutral color thread
- straight pins, scissors, marking pen or pencil

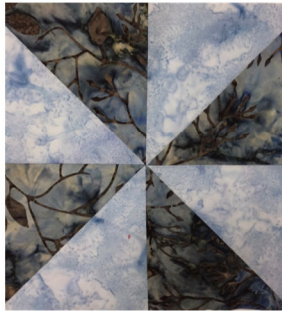
Optional, but really useful:

- rotating cutting mat: square at least 14” x 14”, or round at least 16” in diameter
- small portable design “wall”
- very small iron and ironing pad

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***BEYOND* the Disappearing Nine-Patch**

like this . . .



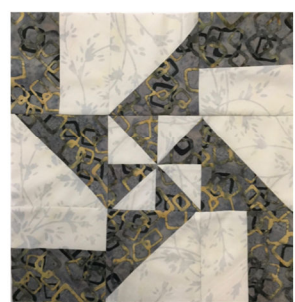
